2023 Scholarship Application

Established in 1929, the Ninety-Nines is the oldest international organization of women pilots in the world. In 1931, Amelia Earhart was elected the first President, and the group selected the name "Ninety-Nines" to represent the 99 charter members.

- **The ENE 99's Trish Sauve Honorary Scholarship (\$2,000)** honors a long-time member of the ENE Chapter and is awarded to a **woman or a man** who has **at least soloed**.
- **The William Bridge Scholarship (\$2,000)** is funded by Eastern New England Chapter member Ann Bridge Baddour in memory of her father, and is awarded to a **woman with at least a private pilot certificate** who is **pursuing an advanced rating**.
- **The Jeanne Ohnemus/Cynthia Hurvitz Scholarship (\$2,000)** is open to a **woman who has soloed**.
- **The ENE 99s Takeoff Scholarships (2 Scholarships of \$1,000 each)** funded by an anonymous donation is open to a **female student pilot** who is at least 16 years of age, with at least 6 hours of flight training in the past 6 months, and has a student pilot certificate or a logbook endorsement from a CFI verifying citizenship.

Scholarship Requirements

- Must be a resident of one of the six New England states (Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine, or Vermont) who is studying anywhere in the US, or a resident of any state who is studying in one of the New England states.
- Candidate must be at least 16 years old and studying in some area of aviation, at a duly accredited school, college flight school, or flight training through an FAA approved flight school or individual flight instructor.
- Must have financial need for the scholarship
- Must have at least a current 3rd class medical (except for Takeoff Scholarship)

Additional Criteria

- High interest and dedication to aviation as a vocation or an avocation
- Academic or professional achievement
- Involvement in aviation activities
- Quality of recommendations
