It's scholarship application time for the opportunities offered by our Chapters, our New England Section, and our International organization. We all know flight training can be pricey, but there is so much help from our organization for members who are committed to both their aviation goals and to the 99's.

The requirements and deadlines for each scholarship are different, so please read the websites carefully. Chapter applications are due by December 15. Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship applications are due to be submitted to the Chapter Chair by January 1. Applications for the Section scholarship are due January 15.

It is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that you get your application in EARLY, especially the Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship. We are most interested in helping present a thorough application to the trustees, and often revisions need to happen well before deadlines. We want you to succeed!
